BEAS – Business Environment Assessment Study

Premiere of the BEAS Warsaw report!

Below is the fifth edition of the study on the investment potential of Polish cities, prepared by Antal and Cushman & Wakefield based on the survey of over 1,000 decision-makers from enterprises in Poland.

With a score of 7.5/10, Warsaw is among the most attractive locations for business, right next to Krakow and the Tri-City.

The capital city achieved the highest scores in the country in four key areas:

- Infrastructure 8.3
- Office space availability 8.3



- Business potential 8.1
- Employment potential 7.4

A lower rating (compared to other locations) -7.4 – concerned the overall attractiveness of the capital as a place to live.

BEAS is a comprehensive tool for investors that helps to assess the real potential of cities based on market and business data. It facilitates investment planning, taking into account, among other things, legal regulations, demographic changes, and administrative support.

The report analyzes seven key areas: infrastructure, the office space market, administration, education, employment, business potential, and general quality of life.

ASB - New Guidance on Polish Withholding Tax



New Guidance on Polish Withholding Tax

The Polish Ministry of Finance has published its final guidance on the application of the beneficial owner (BO) clause under the Polish withholding tax (WHT) regime. This is particularly relevant for Hungarian companies involved in dividend, interest, or royalty payments.

To qualify for preferential WHT treatment, the beneficiary must:

- Receive and use the payment for their own benefit, bearing the economic risk.
- Not act as an intermediary or be obliged to transfer the payment further.
- Conduct genuine business activity in their country of residence.

The assessment is based on economic substance rather than formal ownership. Intragroup arrangements do not automatically exclude BO status but require individual analysis.

The rules apply only to passive income and cover both EU exemptions and double tax treaties. For related parties, stricter verification is required, while for unrelated parties, a tax residence certificate and BO statement may suffice.

Applying the guidance provides legal certainty, so Hungarian investors should ensure their structures and documentation comply with the requirements to mitigate WHT risks in Poland.



BUSINESS NEWS FROM HUNGARY

CURRENT NEWS FROM PETERKA PARTNERS



The goal of the Polish-Hungarian Chamber of Commerce is to provide its members with up-to-date business information about the Hungarian market. In cooperation with our member company, PETERKA & PARTNERS, we would now like to draw attention to two important recent changes:

Government Decree 276/2025 on ESG Act Enforcement

Government Decree 276/2025 (VIII. 21.) on the rules for imposing fines for breaches of the ESG Act (Act CVIII of 2023) has been adopted. The Decree, effective from 6 September 2025, sets out detailed rules on the amounts of, and criteria for, fines to be imposed by the Supervisory Authority for Regulatory Activities (SARA). The rules introduce transparent and proportionate penalties (e.g., unauthorized ESG contributor services: HUF 200,000–10

million; unauthorized ESG data requests: HUF 1 million and up to 1% of turnover, capped at HUF 50 million; failure to submit ESG data to SARA: HUF 200,000–2 million; failure to provide preparatory programmes: HUF 200,000–3 million). Multiple and repeated infringements may lead to aggregated or repeated fines, with payment due within eight days. SARA will assess the impact on sustainable development and any good-faith remedial steps when setting the exact amount.

SARA Decree No. 8/2025 on NIS2 Registration

The Hungarian Supervisory Authority for Regulatory Affairs (SARA) has issued a decree, Decree No. 8/2025 (VIII. 21.), extending the scope of information required for NIS2 registration under the Hungarian Cybersecurity Act. From 22 August 2025, entities must indicate the total number of electronic information systems under their control in addition to the data already required. The number is relevant for statutory documentation and for calculating the maximum fee of the mandatory cybersecurity audit. Entities already registered must provide this information by 31 December 2025.
